\$10M suit in zoo ordeal

A man and his pregnant fiancée are demanding \$10 million from the Bronx Zoo because they were stuck on a cable car for five hours above some fangbaring, flesh-eating baboons.

"They didn't know if they were going to live or die," said lawyer Adam Shapiro, who filed the couple's lawsuit yesterday.

Damien Foster and Nandi Taylor say that they suffered "psychological trauma" and that Wednesday's ordeal put the pregnancy at risk.

"She started having contractions, and her cervix started to dilate," Shapiro said. "She didn't know if she was going to give

birth in the cable car."

According to Shapiro, Taylor was taken to Jacobi Medical Center, where her contractions stopped, but her pregnancy is now considered "high risk."

The Wildlife Conservation Society, which runs the zoo and the Skyfari cable-car ride, declined to comment. Three dozen people were stranded until about II p.m. amid lightning.
